THE MURPHY'S LAW OF MENSTRUATION

Depending upon the situation, being caught off-guard is an impetus for inconvenience. Of **US women ages 18-54 years** that have ever been out in public and unexpectedly started their period, a national study commissioned by Free The Tampons shows:



86 PERCENT STARTED THEIR PERIOD UNEXPECTEDLY IN PUBLIC WITHOUT THE SUPPLIES THEY NEED.
